Introduction:

Manav Sansadhan Evam Mahila Vikas Sansthan is a state level non-government organization (NGO). It was established in 1990 under guidance of veteran social scientist and contemporary Vice Chancellor of Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidhyapeeth & M.P (Member of Parliament), Prof. Raja Ram Sashtri. It is a secular and non-political Institution, which intended working without any personal benefits.

How to up lift to the livelihood standard of poor's & villagers through introducing new employment opportunities and technical changes in traditional artisans? How to abolish to the social evils diffused within our society & finely how to ensure the government schemes possible to the unprivileged section of society? MSEMVS Varanasi has tried to answer above all question by taking responsibility of social obligations through community development with following objectives:

- To eradicate slavery & bonded labor through mobilizing local powers.
- To provide social justice & economic equality to women & exploited in the society.
- To provide new income earning sources by the developing new technology in to traditional handicrafts and promotion of Khadi related programs
- To provide education, healths, employment, to the poor's, exploited & brings them into the main stream of society and to developed self-independent among youths.
- Try to maintain peace & harmony in favor of society & nation.
- To facilitate environmental protection.
- To create an enabling environment in favor of PLHA and promoting preventive measures for HIV & AIDS.

Progress At a Glance:

During the year 2016-17 following intervention done by MSEMVS and the progress are being explained as:

School for Freedom Project:

MSEMVS implemented transitional school and remedial coaching project for the children come out from child labour and debt bondage.

MSEMVS Educational Program consisted:

- Each MSEMVS School enrolls averaging 35-45 children, usually aged 6 – 14 years.
- The mainstream curriculum covers Hindi Language, Math, Science and Environment, to ensure that the children are successful in the state examinations and are able to enter government-run schools.
- Lessons are taught not only traditionally, but also through the use of games and activities. The teachers ensure the active participation of children and make learning fun and interesting.
- In addition, teachers emphasize the following areas:
 - Awareness generating and advocacy on the local level – how to influence the Panchayat Raj Institutions (village government).
 - Community organization and self-help groups.
 - Emotional and mental health care of the children – education must take into account prior traumatic experiences.
 - Legal rights, illegality of slavery, bonded labor and child labor in India's laws.
 - Hygiene and cleanness
 - Moral science
 - Physical training, meditation, cultural activities
 - Social education classes

During 2016-17 three transitional schools completed its tenure and more than 130 children linked permanently with Govt. schools the parents were made able to take care of the children's retention in the school. Apart from that 12 transitional enabled more than 400 children to get accelerated education. Most of the children had supported to quit from child labour. Their parents supported accessing their socio-economic rights and entitlements. MSEMVS worked for livelihood reintegration of the community members in Mushar hamlet in 12 villages and 18 Self Help Groups were strengthened. Micro Finance and Micro Enterprises plan prepared in 8 self help groups and duck farming, washing powder making and dress making skill training provided.

Sensitization and empowerment of community for eradication of child labour and prevention of child trafficking:

The Institution initiated for eradication & rehabilitation of child labor in Varanasi and Bhadohi after an historical verdict had been given on 10 December 1996 by the Honorable Supreme Court of India under which it was provision made that bellows 14 years children are not allowed to any hazardous industries or enterprises. Due to pressure of this verdict a lot of children were freed from work but there was not sufficient provisions for rehabilitation and education for children. The institution is continuously working for eradication and rehabilitation of bonded labour, debt bonded and child labour in three districts of Eastern Uttar Pradesh; Varanasi, Bhadohi and Chandauli. During 2016-17 MSEMVS worked in Jamalpur block of Mirzapur with TDH aiming "Improvement in living conditions in 18 villages of Jamalpur block of Mirzapur District, UP, through empowerment and sensitization of community to protect child rights and prevent child trafficking and stop child labour practice".

The major achievements of the project:

Baseline assessment has been updated in all 18 project villages by trained staff. Village profile and line listing revised according to the village profile register. Finding of the baseline was disseminated among project team member and other stakeholders like Scholl teacher, PRI members, health service providers and village and block child protection committee.

Altogether 14 community groups have been formed in 14 villages. A total of 336 community members are part of these groups where in 96 meetings have been conducted on different issues likes- child labour, migration, child rights, Health and sanitation, trafficking, Environments.

Community in already trained and they got success to access total of 99 children have been enrolled in Primary school, 31 community people have opened bank accounts, 107 people have associated with PDS services, 294 community people made their Adhar card, 5 community people made their voter card, 1 children got their birth certificate, 13

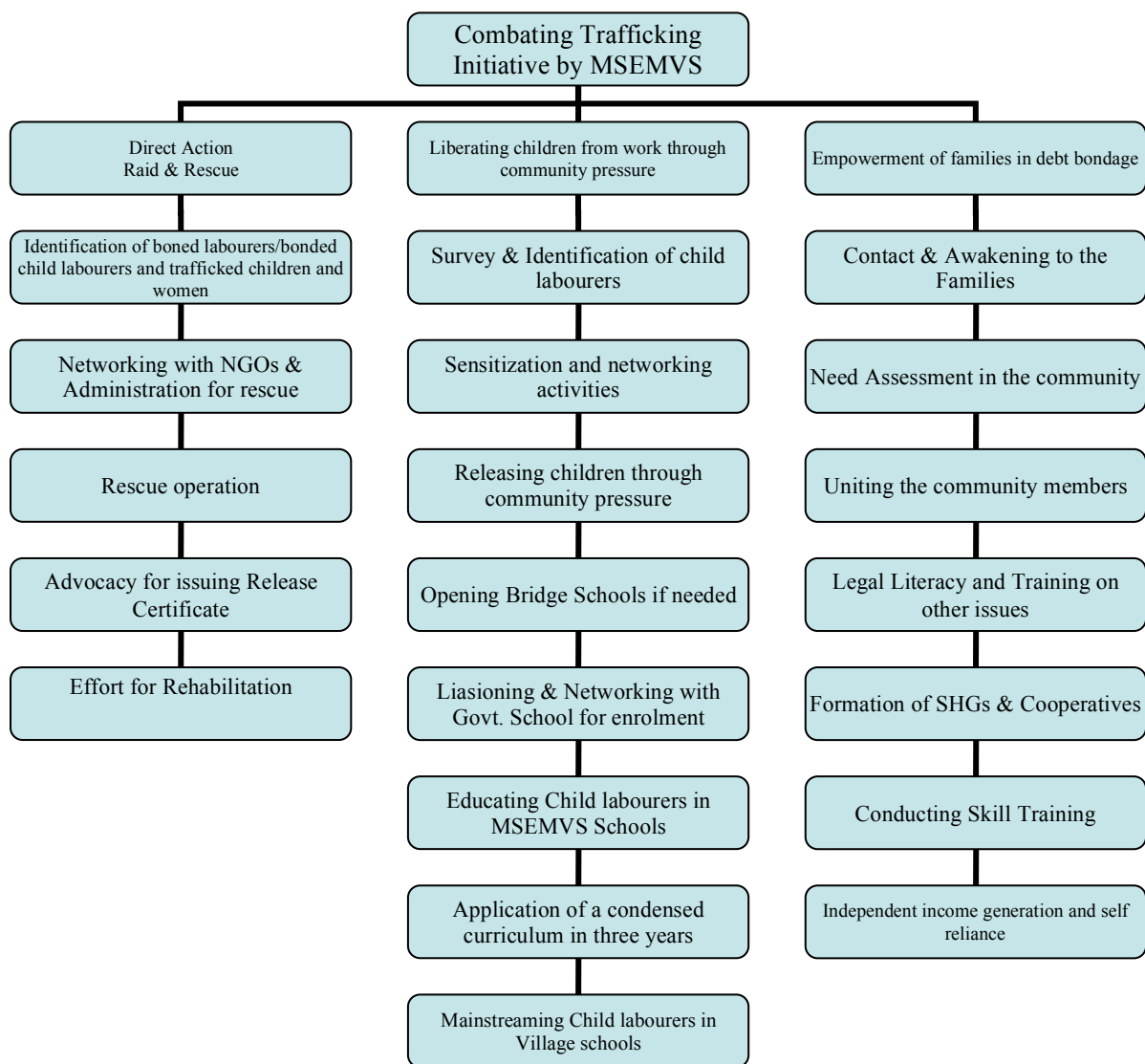
<p>families received Samajwadi pension, 13 families received job cards, 130 children received vaccination, 215 community people received Ujjwal scheme, 15 community people benefit from Indri Awas scheme 11 children are benefit in Modi Jan-Dhan Scheme and 53 women have been associated with ICDS. Training has been planned with community groups members on unsafe migration, child rights and human.</p>
<p>World play day was celebrated on 28th May 2016 and 286 children actively participated in games, essay and drawing competitions. The local & traditional games were organised to preserve traditional games and its value.</p> <p>On the occasion of World day against child labour (12th June) a rally was organized with support of community, schools and youth. A total 70 children actively participated in rally. To aware on child rights and child protection in villages. Participate were displaying the slogan on child rights, child labour and child protection.</p> <p>On the occasion of World environment day (5th June) a raised 2 rallies were organized with support of PRI members, SHGs members, community and youths. Approximately 250 PRI, community youth and children actively participated in rallies. These rallies covered the schools, Market, Panchayat and villages. The rallies got success to aware the general massage on Save environments, pollution, save tree in villages through slogans.</p> <p>On the occasion of ANTI TRAFFICKING DAY (30th July) a cycle rally was organised with support of Block level functionaries. This rally covered the Block, Market, Block resource centre, Chauraha, community health centre other services centres and villages. To aware on Human trafficking and bonded labour in villages through miking, slogans and handbills. Approximately 125 youths actively participated in rally.</p> <p>Essay and drawing competition conducted on “ecological rights of children” in schools and collages during Global Action month. A total 211 youths and children were participated in programs. On the occasion of International human right day (10th December 2016) a march was organised. The education and health departments, Children and Youths actively involved in the event. Approximately 95 children and youths actively participated in rally.</p>
<p>Community help desk are being run in 18 villages. The community help desk is helping community people to get the information and access govt schemes likes- Pension, AWAS, PDS, Ujjawal scheme, ADHAR and Voter card, certificate etc. Survey was also conducted in 50 household to understand the status of the families. Migration tracking tools has been made and tracking has been updated in all the 18 project villages.</p> <p>Block level service provider training conducted by MSVS and district Child protection Unit. 200 AWWs participated in training. They learnt the provision as well as the role and responsibility about village level child protection committee.</p>
<p>3 Health camps organised at Ovenwa, Dhuriya and Jafarkhani. 300 peoples were benefited and provided to health related counseling and free medicines.</p>
<p>Monthly meetings were being conducted in the 16 SHG's. A total of 89 meetings have been conducted and 172 women have participated at the meeting. Apart from saving and microenterprises child labour, child trafficking, education, health, accessibility to various govt schemes also discussion in the meetings.</p> <p>2 Cluster level trainings were organized by MSEMVS with the SHG members. A total 98 members actively participated in the training. Members learnt about the NRLM scheme for SHG. A total of 9 SHG's (92 members) provided with various skill training as per their interest. And marketing potential of detergent powder making, tailoring.</p>
<p>A total of 3 remedial centres with 107 students run project area and altogether 107 children are getting educational support. Apart from regular curriculum human rights education (Child Rights, AWW, Sanitation, PDS, Child Labour,) and basic education were</p>

provided to children.
<p>A total of 18 children forum has been formed in 18 villages. A total of 171 children are part of this forum where in 47 meetings have been conducted on different issues like child rights, trafficking, health, and education.</p> <p>They children are participating in ICDS, PDS and health related activities at village level.</p> <p>2 days capacity building workshop has been conducted on 29 & 30 April 2016. 41 children actively participated in workshop. The workshop was focus on child rights and child participation.</p>
<p>A total of 15 Youth clubs have been established in 15 villages having a total of 128 youths as part of the clubs. A total of 44 meetings have been conducted and informed about child rights, trafficking, risky migration, health, education.</p> <p>2 days capacity building workshop has been conducted on 29 & 30 August 2016. 42 Youths actively participated in workshop. The workshop was focus on child rights, environment, child protection and Child Protection committee.</p> <p>109 Youths completed their trainings in tailoring, screen-printing in 3 vocational training centres. The next batches of vocational training will be started in Janaury-2016.</p> <p>Certification done by MSEMVS. Staffs have been search of local shops, market and place and Networking meeting conducted with potential Employment for job placements to youths.</p>
<p>A total of 18 Village CPC has been established. 28 meetings have been conducted in this year. A total of 1 Block level CPC meetings have been conducted with support of block and village level official.</p>
<p>A block level co-ordination meeting conducted with the support of PRI and health departments. 44 Village heads sand 44 ANMs sensitized on child rights and child protection in this meeting.</p> <p>A cluster level meeting conducted with village level PRI members. 34 PRI members sensitized on child protection committee, health services.</p> <p>A cluster level training conducted with village level PRI members. 37 PRI members sensitized on child rights, child protection and child line.</p>
<p>Monthly meetings are also being conducted for proper planning, implementation and execution of the project. And time to time training proved to staffs for their capacity building.</p>
<p>Wall writings in 239 different places have been done focussing on awareness on child labour, child trafficking, health, education, Save Environment, and services.</p> <p>IEC (Posters, Handbills, Video Show and BBC audio) used in village and cluster level meetings and awareness activities.</p>
<p>117 women's trained on skills training and 57 members are production and marketing of product and Linkages to banks of 5 SHGs (53 members) under the NRLM scheme.</p>
<p>A total of 107 children enrolled in remedial centres and 35 children effectively reintegrated from child labour.</p>
<p>157 village level functionaries sensitised about children's safety, child rights and child protection committee through meetings and workshops.</p>



Mobilizing Local Power to End Trafficking (SLP):

MSEMVS is working in 11 districts in UP, Jharkhand and Chhatisgarh for eradicating bonded labour, debt bonded and child labour with support of US State department, Geneva Global Inc. and FTS. For this MSEMVS adopted an integrated approach of strategy consists direct action like raid & rescue operation, empowering rural poors in debt bondage through organizing them and income generation. The strategy of the project can be represented by following-



With above strategy MSEMVS also involves Legal intervention for ensuring Human Rights with support of FTS and Geneva Global and currently 119 court cases are being perused by the organization.

Community vigilance committees: It is an organization of such people those who were victims of Human Rights violation and now they are organized at village level and they are active as pressure group on the issue of their fundamental rights, social security & trafficking of women's & children. These CVCs are working for providing the rights to the victims related to women's, children, human trafficking. MSEMVS has established 103 CVCs in three districts in Eastern U.P. in which 39 are now at the stage of self-sustaining.

Support to individuals coming out from bonded labour and human trafficking:

With the support of Freedom for All MSEMVS worked ensuring livelihood and social empowerment to the individuals and community groups in Varanasi, Bhadohi and Chandauli.

The major achievements of the project:

2 ATWGs (Anti trafficking women group) formed in Varanasi urban slums area. The women and girls go to the residential areas to work as maid and servant in the houses of

rich people. Many of them are victim and vulnerable to trafficking and forced labour. The groups are activated to be vigil on the issue of trafficking and bonded labour. In two ATWGs 32 women members were trained on the issues and made activated.
12 meeting/training conducted with ATWGs members by MSEMVS activists on the issue of human trafficking, child trafficking, and child labour, bonded labour and domestic slavery. Altogether 30 women actively participated in these meetings.
For making them self-dependent "Tailoring training" was organized by MSEMVS team with the help of trained instructor. 32 ATWGs members participated in these trainings.
Now the ATWGs members started support to MSEMVS team for identifies cases, aware to other women and men regarding domestic slavery, human trafficking and child labour issues.
4 groups volunteers meeting / training and many one to one volunteers training organized by MSEMVS teams regarding human trafficking, child labour, bonded labour, modern forms of slavery and case identification. All 20 volunteers support to MSEMVS team work which is held on their near living places.
MSEMVS is targeting the survivors who didn't get any relief from Government and provide them Individual Income Generation opportunities by giving the micro enterprises and jobs. This is called IGP (Individual Income Generation Programme).
During the reporting period 46 survivors in Varanasi, Bhadohi and Chandauli provided Individual Income Generation Programme. Those survivors are released from brick kiln, agriculture, textile mills etc. from Uttar Pradesh and other states.
Those 46 survivors got skill to operate their micro business and exposure visit to other successful Individual Income Generation Programme was organized to give them an insight about the business.
The trained MSEMVS workers did regular follow-up of Individual Income Generation Programme.
Quarterly survivor meets organized in which education, health, livelihood and human rights issues are discussed with the help of audio-visual aid.
Awareness campaigns organized by MSEMVS in school/collages on the issue of human trafficking and child labour. MSEMVS team tried to aware through movies, which is made by MTV and IJM as well as distributed handbills. More than 400 girls and boys made aware through these awareness programs.
MSEMVS team developed posters, banners and handbills on the issue of human trafficking, child labour, child trafficking and safe migration and pasted posters and Banners in Bus and railway stations and other places of city market for general people awareness on the occasion of Deepawali (festival of lights) and distributed more than 1500 handbills with the help of volunteers.





Nyay Panchayat Trafficking Eradication Project:

Year 2016-17 was the period of intense grassroots intervention and applies good practices. During the reporting period MSEMVS achieve success according to Benchmark and target. In the Nyay Panchayat in Jamalpur, Mirzapur the issues was address effectively.

The major achievements of the project:

267 CVC members are able to speak out on the issue of bonded labour and human trafficking and active to prevent their family members. 38 more members joined the CVCs.
64 Survivors have actively become the part of Community vigilance committees due to after care.
125 individuals equipped with safety measures of the distressed migration thorough counseling and verification of the employers.
130 children regularly attained the class in 4 transitional schools/Remedial coachings.
78 children liberated from situation of slavery through education transitory rehabilitation.
22 children of children's committee members have been trained on child rights and child labour and delivering educating other children and adults about child rights.
8 children of children's committee have selected the members of Village level Child Protection Committees under ICPS (a Govt. of India scheme).
48 SHGs members trained on primary commercial tailoring and started the advance training.
21 girls joined the training of commercial tailoring this will led their delayed marriage as the early marriage is prevalent in the community.
33 boys trained on Electric motor binding, Painting, putty and carpentry in this reporting period.
In these reporting period 2 adult victims freed from slavery through mediation with the employer.
8 survivors sustained their IGP and said "no" to the employers from whom they had taken debt.
156 youths actively involved with the anti trafficking campaign. This is a great sign for the MSEMVS as those youth will be the generation who start fighting against slavery in their community at the early stage of life.
102 members of village level child protection committee are active on child related issue in villages.
More than 55 PRI members were sensitized on Safe migration, human trafficking and VCPC.
200 village level AWW were sensitized on village level child protection committee and their functionaries.
Through the sensitization and block level advocacy the 626 entitlements were secured for the CVC members.
8 meeting have been conducted with member's village level Child protection committee in 8 villages. And 1 Block level CPC meeting has been conducted with the support of Block level official.
2 cycle rally organized and more than 200 people were participated.
Block level Service providers training conducted by MSEMVS and district level child protection unit.

During 2015-16 more than 600 individuals obtained govt. entitlements with support of MSEMVS





Livelihood Support to Community Members and survivors:

With the support of MNS Foundation Livelihood Support to Community Members and survivors alongside activating ICPS mechanism initiated in early 2017. The proposed project aimed to enable vulnerable communities to develop resistance to bonded in more than 30

villages of four districts through effective community mobilization, Livelihood reintegration, Legal support and establishing safe migration mechanism.

The major achievements of the project:

Recruitment and Orientation of staff members done.
30 CVCs identified for covering SHG activities.
Database of SHG, Youths and CVC members prepared
Feasibility study carried out for vocational skills most likely to enable youth to earn income and most possible for young people and SHG women.
Work done with trainers to design courses and make linkages with accreditation bodies, to certify graduates.
Formation of 12 Self Help Groups consisting with averaging 12 women in each group.
Advocates engaged in the project and orientation will be given.
The survivors facilitated for getting their entitlements including compensation and rehabilitation money from the government
Sensitization done of officials from village level to district level responsible to implement ICPS in the districts.

Rural Industries service centre-Terracotta Pottery:

MSEMV established a Pottery Training and Production Centre for Terracotta Pottery. Under RISC (Rural Industries Service Centre) scheme of Khadi & Village industries Commission (KVIC) the organization initiated this intervention for upliftment of poor rural artisans. Six batches of 90 artisans including women got training of terracotta pottery. Terracotta made water filter, clay refrigerator, murals, designer pots and utilities, roof & floor tiles etc are produced by the trainees at this centre. Now the RISC is well connected with production and marketing and it contribute in MSEMV other development work.

Parents Awareness on Child Trafficking:

MSEMV worked with Aangan Trust to prevent children from trafficking. One village was targeted in this project with following achievements:

Making our PACT mother empower through making them informed client of community
To plan and discuss all serious harm cases and plan the intervention. Sharing same with Aangan facilitator and getting support
Making adolescent girls (Shakti girl) as informed client , so that they know how to act in vulnerable condition and take informed decision

Bringing Govt scheme in community so that actual beneficiaries is benefited
