Introduction

Manav Sansadhan Evam Mahila Vikas Sansthan was established in 1990. Founded under the guidance and involvement of the esteemed social scientist and former Vice Chancellor of Mahatma Gandhi Kashi Vidyapeeth and Member of Parliament, Prof. Raja Ram Shastri. Prof. Shastri and many activists with Gandhian thoughts (Mr. M.L.Prajapati a terracotta / ceramic expert and worked with Khadi & Village Industries Commission, GoI, Mr. Chhote Lal Sharma, Editor of an evening news paper in Varanasi, and Dr. R.J.Vishwakarma, IMS BHU and few more social workers) founded MSEMVS dedicated to empowering marginalized communities and fostering societal transformation through social and economic empowerment of the women in the outskirts of Varanasi.

Goal: To support marginalized communities for equitable access to resources, services, and skills development, fostering their active participation for helping themselves .

Manav Sansadhan Evam Mahila Vikas Sansthan works on the issues of children, women and marginalized communities through awareness and facilitating education, health and livelihood services with a central theme of “Promoting Development through Services”

During year 2024-25 , Manav Sansadhan Evam Mahila Vikas Sansthan focuses its work on: **Continuing support to the vulnerable and marginalized families** in their education, health and livelihood through a mix of activities in order to support the children in project communities and prevent them from the child labour, child marriage, child abuse and child trafficking.

- Support and strengthen child protection mechanisms (SMC, VLCPC, DCPU etc.) with involvement of communities and local government bodies through capacity building, handholding support and sensitization.
- Supporting children's overall development and wellbeing through helping them in learning improvement, make them retained in schools, promoting safe schools, Life skill training and leadership building.
- Supporting Govt. Agencies to reach the unreached for ensuring social securities schemes and welfare programs such as education, health, labour welfare, livelihood, sanitation, water and housing etc.
- Collaboration and coordination with Govt. departments for capacity building of the stakeholders and promoting reporting mechanisms on child protection issues at village level.

- Development of IEC (Information, Education & Communication) materials with consultation of Govt. and other agencies on children's issues for use by multiple stakeholders while planning and implementing the child centric programs either in village or in school.
- Promoting children's leadership and providing them forums and platforms to express their aspirations, successes and dreams to the wider audiences for making child friendly communities.

During the year 2024-25 , Manav Sansadhan Evam Mahila Vikas Sansthan worked in Varanasi, Bhadohi, Mirzapur, Jaunpur and Chandauli in UP and Panipat in Haryana and Jaipur in Rajasthan.

Major Achievements:

During the year 2024-25, the major achievements are-

- ❖ One of the beneficiaries (a Girl from Vanvasi community) supported by Manav Sansadhan Evam Mahila Vikas Sansthan through educational and livelihood services to her and her parents. Her leadership was recognized when she was chosen as a 'Member-for-a-Day' of the Uttar Pradesh State Commission for Protection of Child Rights. On that day, she made her mark—quite literally—by signing an official order directing the District Magistrate of Ballia to take action in a case involving a child's right to education. It was a powerful moment, symbolizing not only her journey but her vision for the future. Chanchal also became a "Brand Ambassador" for women and child development department in Chandauli district and represented in many state and national events organized for child marriage free India .





- ❖ Training of Counselors of DCPU (District Child Protection Units): The organization with the support of British Asian Trust conducted the training for Counselors of DCPU of all 75 districts of Uttar Pradesh during 4 to 7 December, 2024 at NIPCCD Lucknow.

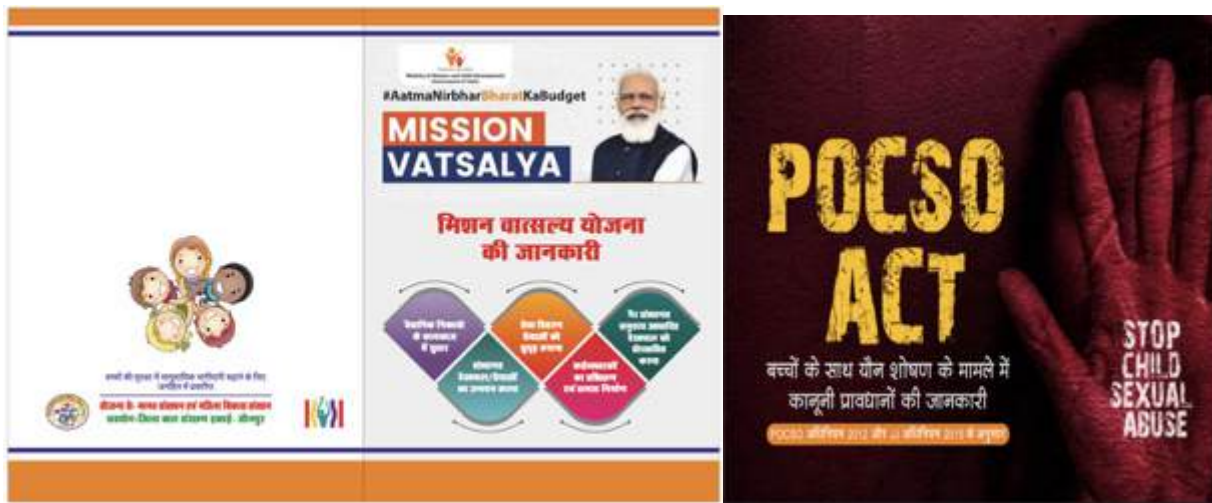

- ❖ Support given to **722 individuals** for income generation and economic resilience through providing Micro-Enterprise support (Trades, Businesses and jobs oriented), business plan development, Entrepreneurship training and follow-up support to the Micro-Enterprise holders.



- ❖ Altogether 774 individuals including women and youth provided vocational skills training and follow-up support in order to make them able to start a job or micro-enterprise.



- ❖ More than 10 thousand children were supported through education and learning support programs through remedial coachings, School Tracking and TaRL support.

Major activities :

- Child Friendly Centres (15 centres) within the school premises to promote learning, interest in education and development of children.
- Remedial education using child friendly methodology
- Library with 200 books will be set up at the each centre and reading sessions
- Talent development sessions are conducted for children by organizing activities like drawing, dance, drama, games, singing, painting, craft work, designing etc to promote creative thinking among children.
- The Education Department and MSEMVS jointly organized a rally at 7 villages in the village to create awareness about enrollment and retention of children.
- Summer camps win the month of May for 25 days every year to engage children in meaningful recreational & extra-curricular activities during school holidays for children.
- Annual sports event/ Bal Mela on the final day of the summer camp at the Panchayat level. The sports tournaments enable children to observe World Play Day.
- Training on street theatre along with cultural performing arts like traditional instrumental music and traditional dance forms.

- Monthly meetings/ Quarterly meetings of VCPC and SMC support in the and Quarterly training on “Child Right to Participation and Development” for VCPC representatives.
- Quarterly trainings for community members at Gram panchayat level on food and nutrition, healthy eating habits, regulations for functioning of PDS, Anganwadi, mid-day meal in schools
- Awareness talks every month, games on healthy eating practices in schools reaching 50 children in schools,
- Community food exhibition / food fair at the Gram Panchayat level.
- Take up pond, river and other natural water resources management, waste segregation, restoration of mining affected land, promote organic farming & traditional crops management, soil conservation and biodiversity conservation activities.
- Skill development training to youths on driving, computer applications, Tailoring etc and link interested youths, women to the Skill India Mission
- Support to Women for entrepreneurship development with which they could start income generation initiatives either independently or in groups .Single women and women headed families that have child workers will be given priority. Livelihood activities like establishing petty shops, wholesale food grains and groceries, fast food centres, animal husbandry, clothes marketing are supported.
- Facilitating Child Friendly Villages (as per theme -3 of taken by Government) involving the villagers, children and PRI.

Major activities and achievements:

- Conduct village-level awareness campaigns (street plays, puppet shows, community meetings) on the importance of education, the harms of child marriage and labor, and available child protection mechanisms.
- Establish community-based learning centers or after-school support programs with trained facilitators to provide academic assistance and engaging learning activities.
- Organize regular health camps in villages focusing on child health check-ups, immunizations, growth monitoring, and nutritional assessments.

- Provide school enrollment drives with community mobilization and incentives (e.g., school kits) to increase initial enrollment and regular attendance.
- Train teachers in child-friendly teaching methodologies, utilizing Teaching-Learning Material (TLM) and Multi-Level Teaching (MLT) approaches, with ongoing professional development workshops.
- Establish and equip village libraries or reading corners with age-appropriate books and learning resources accessible to children and adults.
- Conduct participatory health awareness sessions focusing on preventive healthcare, maternal and child health, and promoting health-seeking behaviors, utilizing local languages and cultural contexts.
- Facilitate the construction and use of household and community toilets through awareness campaigns and linkages with relevant government schemes (e.g., Swachh Bharat Abhiyan).
- Implement community-led initiatives for ensuring access to safe drinking water sources and promoting water conservation practices.
- Strengthen School Management Committees (SMCs) and Village Level Child Protection Committees (VLCPCs) through regular training on their roles and responsibilities in child protection and development.
- Facilitate the formation and strengthening of women's Self-Help Groups (SHGs), providing training on group management, financial literacy, and sustainable livelihood options.
- Organize vocational skills training programs based on local market demand (e.g., tailoring, handicrafts, agriculture-related skills) and support the development of business plans and market linkages.

The aim of the project was Promoting Worker safety in the India-Gulf Migration Corridor Project is to promote safe and fair migration and migrants' rights in the South Asia-Gulf migration corridor, using the strategy of awareness raising among migrants, migrant families and returnee migrants; and enhancing and facilitating access to Govt. services and remedy for migrants through existing and emerging technologies. This Project is

implemented in 15 villages of 2 districts (Bhadohi and Mirzapur) And major Activities of project are:

- Awareness Generation among rural youth and potential migrants of 15 villages about unsafe migration to Gulf Corridor countries.
- Dissemination of Safe-Tips guide with do and don't while migrating to other countries in search of jobs.
- Promotion of PoE services and information dissemination activities.
- Capacity building of front line service providers including PRI, AWW,ASHA etc. on the issues of unsafe migration and safe tips guide.
- Capacity building of local villagers and youth on the issues and support the village level vigilance groups who educate the potential migrants about safety measures if he/she seeks to migrate.
- Education and awareness about the laws for migrants in Gulf Corridor countries, Pravasi Bhartiya Bima Yojna, check registered agents through the PoE website, link the workers with pre departure training institutions.
- Linkages with Skill India International Centre of the aspirants of working villages.
